Student's Activity


A Girl student of Sitapur district has been supported by the RASSA for continuing her Diploma study.


RASSA professional activities








2. RASSA Awards, Fellow etc

RASSA Professional Activities

4.1 Teachers' Day celebration

RASSA organised virtual Teachers' Day program on September 5, 2021. In our Veda's Guru Purnima is traditionally observed as a day to worship teachers. Many countries celebrate their Teachers' Day on different days of the months. But in our country, the birthday of the second president Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan (5 September) is celebrated as Teachers' Day since 1962. Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was a staunch believer of education and was a well-known diplomat, scholar, the President of India and above all, a teacher. Teachers' Day is a special day for the appreciation of teachers, and may include celebrations to honor them for their special contributions in a particular field area, or the community in general.

On the Day Prof Ram Kathin Singh Sir was Chief Guest and Sri Ranvir Singh was Guest of honour.

Prof Ram Kathin Singh Sir was born in village Tajopur of erstwhile Azamgarh District, now Mau, on the

01.02.1942. After early education in rural schools, he passed his high school and intermediate from Jiwan Ram Inter College, Mau and topped the UP Board of Examinations in I. Sc. (Ag.). He did his B.Sc. (Ag.) and M.Sc. (Ag.) Botany from Government Agriculture College, Kanpur and secured 1st position in Agra University. After a brief period of teaching at TD Postgraduate College, Jaunpur and GBPUAT, Pantnagar, he proceeded for Germany to pursue higher studies under German Exchange Fellowship. In 1968, Dr. Singh completed his Ph. D. degree from Rostock University, Germany with a rare distinction, 'Suma-cum-laude,' after a gap of 5 years. After a year of post-doctoral work at the Institute of Statistics and Biometrics, Hannover, Germany, he returned to India and joined Haryana Agriculture University as Associate Professor of Genetics in 1970. He then became Professor in 1975, a position that he held till 1984. While at HAU, Dr. Singh developed a world-fame center for teaching and research in 'Biometrical Genetics' which became a referral point for students, teachers and researchers throughout the



world. He also guided a large number of students leading to their M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees. Also, during this period, Dr. Singh received Bursary Award given by British Royal Society and thus, had a chance to work with K. Mather and J. L. Jinks, the founders of Biometrical Genetics, at the University of Birmingham, UK. In 1985, he joined as Professor at BHU, Varanasi for a brief period of about 6 months and then moved to ND University of Agriculture and Technology, Faizabad (now Ayodhya) as Director of Research. He worked there for about 10 years and during this period established a strong center for research by forging close collaboration with national and international organizations, like IRRI, CYMMIT and others. Between 1995 and 2004, he worked for IRRI as Liasion Scientist and Representative and helped to strengthen rice research in India and other South Asian countries. After retirement from IRRI in 2004, Dr. Singh joined NAAS as Secretary and subsequently, as Vice President and worked there for 4 years. All through his professional career, He was deeply involved in research and management and published about 250 research papers in national and international journals. He also authored about 15 books, some of them are widely acclaimed throughout the world. In 2004, Dr. Singh also established an NGO and since then he has been actively working with the farmers, particularly in eastern UP. Some significant achievements include revival of Kalanamak, a rice variety which was once at the verge of extinction, development and promotion of climate-resilient crop varieties and practices to fight climatic aberrations, making farmers self-sufficient in seed by establishing a farmer-led Seed Production, Processing and Distribution Unit. His NGO also runs a 'Farmers' Service Centre' which caters to all the needs of farmers such as seeds, fertilizers, chemicals, farm-equipment etc. Recognizing his services to farmers and science, Dr. Singh has been honored with several awards and appreciation, such as 'Sipani Krishi Anushandhan Farm Award-2005' given by Asia-agri Foundation Society, 1st 'Mahindra Sambridhi Agri-Award-2012' handed over by the then Minister of Agriculture, Sri Sharad Pawar ji and 'PHSS Foundation Award' for Science and Society, Lucknow-2018. He is

also a Hindi writer par excellence and has published over a dozen of books of poetry and stories for which he has received several prestigious awards including the 'Sahitya Bhushan Samman-2014' given by Uttar Pradesh Hindi Sansthan, Lucknow. He is recipient of RASSA Rajarshi Samman 2020.


